<p><b>“Progress Monitoring: An Essential Component of the Response to Intervention (RTI) Process in Making Data-Based Instructional Decisions”</b></p>	<p>Participants will learn the 5 W’s (who, what, why, when, where) of progress monitoring. They will also learn how to use data obtained from progress monitoring in making instructional decisions. (1 PLU)</p>
<p><b>“Progress Monitoring, Response to Intervention (RTI) and the Application of the RTI Process in the Development of Data-Driven IEP’s”</b></p>	<p>Participants will be provided with a definition of progress monitoring and will be taught how to apply and use progress monitoring in the RTI multi-tiered process in the development of data-driven IEP’s to determine the effectiveness of instruction/interventions on instruction. (1 PLU)</p>
<p><b>“Autism Spectrum Disorders”</b></p>	<p>This online course is designed to provide participants with an overview and understanding of individuals with Autism “Spectrum” Disorders (ASD). <p><b>“Functional Behavioral Assessments &amp; Behavior Intervention Plans”</b></p>	<p>Tier 3 intervention. Participants will also learn that it is essential to identify the “function” of a behavior prior to developing a Behavior Intervention Plan for behaviorally at-risk students.</p>
<p><b>“Introduction to Inclusion &amp; Models of Co-Teaching”</b></p>	<p>This online course is designed to provide participants with the basic knowledge and foundations of inclusion and co-teaching. Participants will learn about the legal mandates and requirements for educating students with disabilities in the general education classroom. Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to implement effective inclusion and co-teaching models providing services to students with disabilities in an inclusive environment.</p>
